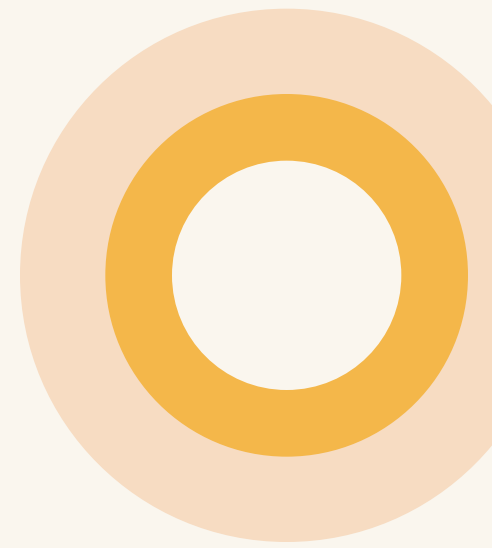

A little lamp for one good afternoon

Four simple, ready-to-print moments for learning about Jesus together. Every Bible story is a brief original paraphrase. Use the listed reference with the Bible translation your family uses at home.

Print + go

- 1 Print one week at a time whenever it works for your family.
- 2 Use ordinary printer paper. Cardstock is optional for game cards.
- 3 Choose 100% or “actual size” when your printer offers it.
- 4 Every activity works in black-and-white, too.
- 5 You do not have to finish every page. A calm ten minutes is enough.

A gentle reminder: you do not need a perfect lesson time. Read the short script, choose one page, and save the rest for later.

BIBLE REFERENCE

Luke 15:1–7

KEY TRUTH

Jesus notices and cares about every person.

READY IN

5–10 min

YOU'LL NEED

Paper, crayons or markers, glue, cotton balls or torn white paper, scissors, and one small object to hide.

PARENT READ-ALOUD

Jesus told a story about a shepherd who counted his sheep and found that one was missing. The shepherd did not say, “There are plenty left.” He went looking until he found the one sheep. When he found it, he carried it home safely and celebrated. Jesus used this story to help people understand that every person matters to God. When someone feels far away, left out, or lost, Jesus’ care is still close.

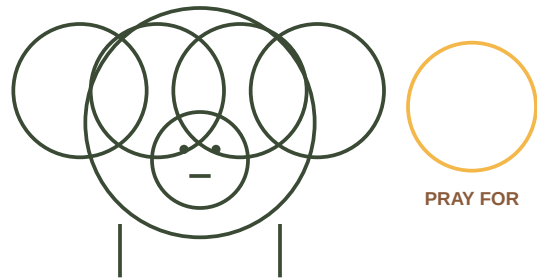
Choose one person who might need encouragement. Draw them a picture, send a kind note, or say a short prayer for them together.

Cotton-ball sheep

MAKE IT

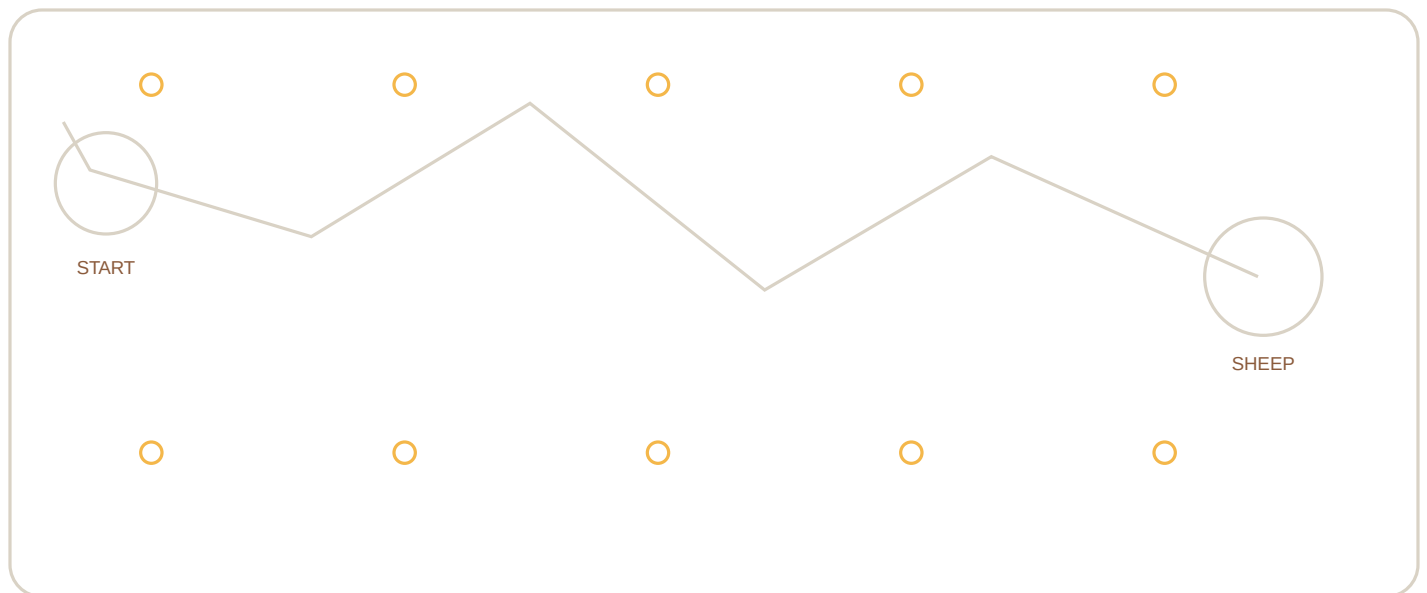
- 1 Color the sheep's face and legs.
- 2 Glue cotton balls or torn white paper inside the woolly outline.
- 3 Draw one person you can remember to pray for in the heart.



FIND THE SHEEP

Color, trace, and notice

Color the meadow. Help the shepherd trace a path through the hills to the sheep. Count the ten small stars and circle the one closest to the sheep.



Care motions

Say “Luke 15:1–7.” Point outward for Jesus looks, put hands over your heart for Jesus cares, and open your arms for every person. Mix up the motions and put them back in order.
